"ABOVE THE BEST" TOUR

An informal poll earlier this year showed that several 174th AHC members who made a similar bus tour to the U.S. Army Aviation Museum at Ft. Rucker five years ago wish to return for another visit. Several who have never seen the new museum also wish to make the tour. So, we aim to please. A bus from the Goodtimes Tour Company of Pensacola, FL, will arrive at our hotel at 7:00 a.m., Saturday morning, October 11th. It will depart for Ft. Rucker as soon as passengers are on board, but no later than 7:30 a.m. Hours at the museum will be 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. The bus should arrive back at the hotel about 4:00 p.m. This schedule allows no time to stop enroute and eat at a restaurant, yet still arrive back at the hotel in time to freshen up for the evening seafood buffet which will begin at 6:00 p.m. To remedy this, arrangements are being made to have a box lunch prepared in the Ft. Rucker area for bus passengers as they embark for the return trip. It is suggested that everyone going on the tour eat a hearty continental breakfast at the hotel or visit a local restaurant for breakfast. Cost for the bus will be \$18 per person plus \$5 for the box lunch and drink, payable with your advance registration. Bob Jones will be the "OIC" on the bus. The Goodtimes company policy normally restricts passengers from eating and drinking on the bus. However, they are making an exception for us with the understanding that all passengers will remove their empty box lunch and drink containers when they disembark. Your cooperation is strongly solicited. "Hey! Don't forget to bring those cameras and camcorders," Bob Jones reminds us.

FISHING

A deep-sea fishing trip is also planned for Saturday, October 11th. Costs could range from \$25 or \$30 for a party boat, up to \$80 each for six people (five hours) on a small charter boat. When the total number of people desiring to go fishing is determined, an attempt will be made to charter a fishing boat to accommodate that number of people. Wally Nunn or Bernie Cobb will then contact you personally and inform you of the estimated cost per person. Payment must be made on arrival at the dock.
